6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

#### 6.3.1 Curriculum Development

Curriculum is framed by the university. However, additional academic inputs are being taught by the teachers along with the regular syllabus.

#### 6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

The learning is made through Student-centered Activities Question – Answer seminars, seminars, symposia group discussions and self evaluated systems. Computer Aided Learning packages are used by the departments.

#### 6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

Evaluation of the performance of students is a continuous process. Unit Tests, Quarterly, Half – Yearly, and Pre-final exams are conducted evaluated and recorded is the Dept marks registers subject wise.

#### 6.3.4 Research and Development

- The college has a Research Committee and 3 staff members are pursing Ph.D.

Regular faculty is recruited by the govt, however, temporary staff is recruited by the CPDC.

The institution has linkages with local industries and MOUs.
